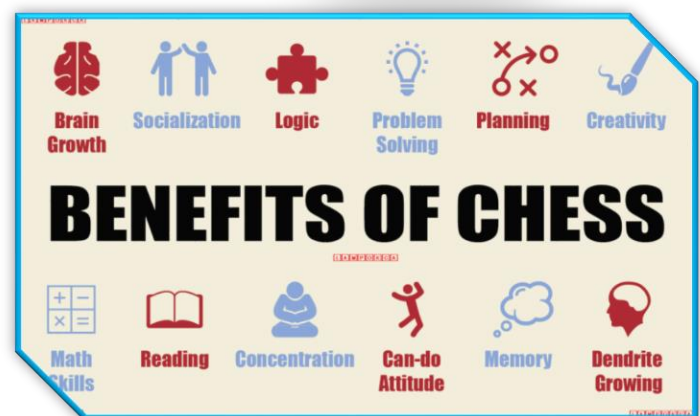


Chess Tournament
