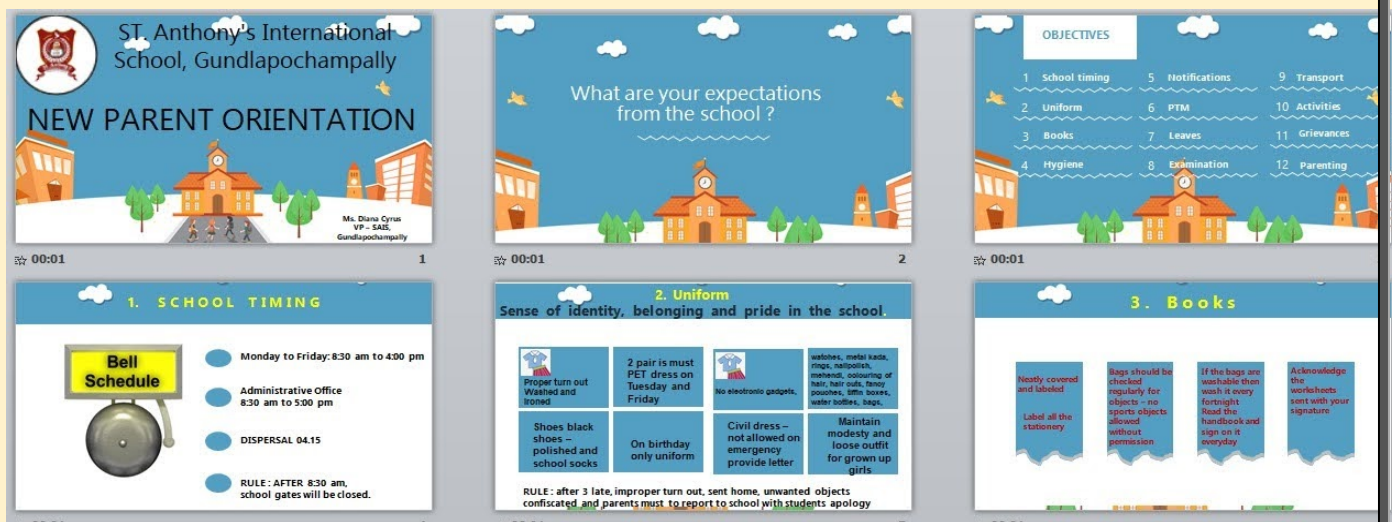




Parent orientation
