# CLASSROOM ACADEMICS ACTIVITIES







**Grade 6 Group Activity: Newspaper Cutting on Livelihood from Different Fields of Occupation Objective:** Students will understand rural and urban livelihoods by exploring different occupations through newspaper clippings. 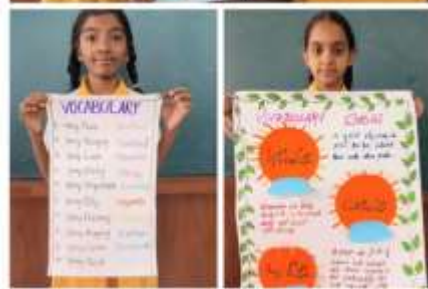

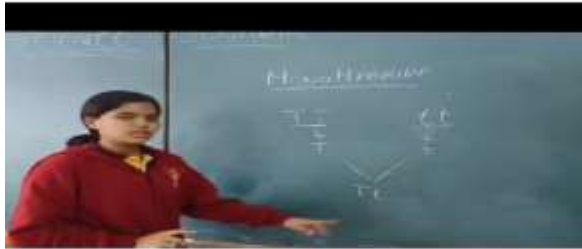

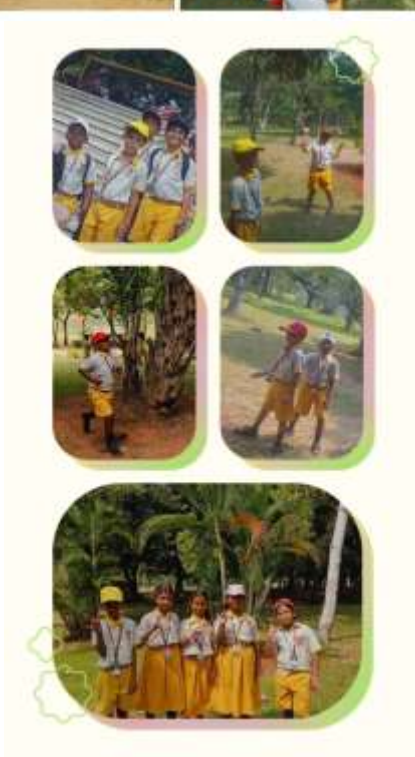
